Requirements:

- All students entering grades 9-12 will choose at least one book to read over the summer from the Summer Reading list
- Students in honors-level courses will choose one book from the list (as noted above) in addition to a required text for each grade level
- Students will take notes as they read, utilizing one of the following methods:
 - Annotation (use post-it notes if the book is borrowed)
 - Dialectical Journal
 - Story Map Graphic Organizer
- ***The notes completed while reading the text will help prepare students to complete one of the following assignments in September. Students will have the choice to:***
 - Create a music soundtrack based upon the text
 - Identify a central idea in the text and write a text analysis essay
 - Create a 3-5 minute presentation about the text utilizing technology
 - Write a prequel, sequel or missing chapter from the text


Further details and instructions will be provided to students when classes begin in September.

*****AP and College-level courses will offer different text selections with their own required assignments*****
